- Online and in person regional and national network meetings.
- Expertise, information, advice and support on a range of issues including governance, fundraising, health, education, benefits, GDPR and safeguarding.
- Free membership of NCVO, NICVA and WCVA, irrespective of your group's income.
- Trustee Indemnity, Employers Liability and Public Liability Insurance.
- Regular newsletters and updates from the Down's Syndrome Association covering national news, resources and policies affecting people who have Down's syndrome.
- Use of the Down's Syndrome Association's 'affiliated to the' (and use the logo) on your group's media and materials
- An Affiliated Groups page on the DSA's website, which is a hub of resources and information.
- Affiliated groups also engage directly with the DSA to help inform planning, activities and national consultations.
- Being identified as an affiliated group on the DSA map of support groups on the DSA's website.

We can also help and support trustees and staff with queries they have about running their group, information useful in supporting families, as well as tips and best practice for running a local support group. The wider network provides opportunities for peer support and promotes the sharing of skills, information, expertise and knowledge.
